Providing a Quality Education in Galt

- **Galt Joint Union High School District and Galt Joint Union Elementary School District are committed to ensuring that all students graduate prepared for success in college, careers and civic life.**
- **Facilities conditions are important to maximize learning and support the variety of services students need across our community.**
- **Galt Joint Union High School District Overview:**
 - Services for approximately 2,200 students from four feeder elementary districts (Archoe, Galt, New Hope, and Oak View).
 - The District is home to two high schools. The current Galt High School facility was built in 1951 and is home to many classrooms/facilities which have not been updated in the past 65 years. Liberty Ranch High School was built in 2007. Projects remain at Liberty Ranch because developer funding that was counted on to complete the high school came up short due to the recession and housing crisis.
- **Galt Joint Union Elementary School District Overview:**
 - Services for approximately 3,800 students, pre-kindergarten through eighth grade.
 - Seven school locations: one preschool, five elementary schools and a middle school.
 - The average age of the schools is 29 years old.
 - 2001 bond supported construction of Robert L. McCaffrey Middle School and Lake Canyon Elem. School.

School Facilities Needs: Taking Action on Facilities Master Planning Efforts

- ▶ Districts have undertaken a thorough Facilities Master Planning process
- ▶ Site-by-site evaluations of classrooms, buildings, and grounds
- ▶ Incorporated input from a variety of community stakeholders: teachers, staff, parents, students and community members

Galt Joint Union High School District: \$47.18 million worth of district-wide needs

Galt Joint Union Elementary School District: \$156 million worth of district-wide needs for seven school locations

Total cost of repairs and modernization is beyond the scope of the Districts' operating budgets.

State Does Not Provide Adequate Funding for Facility Improvements




Athletic fields and facilities need to be updated for safety




Leaky roofs and damaged ceilings must be repaired

Galt High School District

Measure E would provide \$36 million in local funding to:

- Repair leaky roofs, deteriorating plumbing, and faulty sewer system.
 - Update career technical education classrooms for job training.
 - Improve classrooms for science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) programs.
 - Make health, safety, and accessibility improvements.
 - Upgrade inadequate electrical systems.
 - Modernize outdated classrooms, restrooms, and school facilities.
 - Update classroom cabling and infrastructure to support instructional technology.
 - Enhance safety and accessibility of athletic fields.
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State Does Not Provide Adequate Funding for Facility Improvements: Aging Infrastructure



Galt Elementary School District

Measure K would provide \$19.7 million in local funding for:

Major renovations, repairs and upgrades to classrooms and schools throughout the Elementary District. Measure K authorizes improvements in four major categories:

- 1) Improvements for safety and security,
- 2) Modernization of schools,
- 3) Improvement of our existing building systems, and
- 4) Remodeling or expansion to create 21st Century Schools.

Specific examples include:


- Installing safety fencing, lighting and security systems at each school site.
- Repairing and replacing leaky roofs and floors where needed.
- Installing new energy efficient lighting, water, plumbing and control systems throughout the District.
- Improving student access to technology in all classrooms.
- Expanding, developing and remodeling classrooms and libraries to support 21st Century Learning Environments.

How much will the Measures cost?

The proposed tax rate is 3 cents per \$100, or \$30.00 per \$100,000 of assessed value (not market value). For a home with an assessed value of the current median of \$198,220, this is less than \$5.00 per month. Assessed values for most properties are significantly below market value due to Proposition 13.

The Elementary and High School District can each propose a tax rate of up to \$30.00 per \$100,000 of assessed value. If we were one unified district, we could propose up to \$60 per \$100,000 (for example: Elk Grove Unified School District, a K-12 district, is proposing up to \$60.00 per \$100,000 of assessed value).

Fiscal Accountability Is Included

- An independent Citizens' Oversight Committee will be established and annual audits for each bond measure will be performed.
 - All funds stay local and cannot be taken away by the State.
 - Funds cannot be used for administrator or employee salaries, benefits, or pensions.
