
Why the SSHCP?

- Status Quo:
 - Costly, inefficient, & time consuming federal and state permit process
 - Fragmented conservation doesn't work
- SSHCP:
 - Efficient, coordinated permit process
 - More effective conservation

Goal –Integrated Federal/State Permit Solution for Plan Partners

- Plan Partners: Sacramento County, Rancho Cordova, Galt, Southeast Connector JPA, SRCSD
- Permits
 - Endangered Species Act Section 10 Incidental Take (Federal)
 - Clean Water Act Section 404 (Federal)
 - Endangered Species Act Section 2081 Incidental Take; Master Streambed Alteration Agreement (State)
 - Clean Water Act Section 401; Porter-Cologne (Federal/State)

Benefits to the City of Galt

- Relieves burden of locating scarce mitigation lands
- Contributes to regional conservation solution
- Funded by mitigation fees - set and known up front
- Reduces permit processing time - less burden on staff and private sector

SSHCP Plan Components

- 50 Year Permit
 - 33,639 acre impact
 - 36,282 acre preserve system –28 species
- Aquatic Resources Program
- EIS/EIR
- Mitigation/In-lieu Fee Program
- Wetlands Protection Ordinance
- Implementation Agreement
- Local Implementation by JPA

Significant Progress

- Draft SSHCP – complete
- Draft Aquatic Resources Program (ARP) – complete
- Draft ARP Ordinance – complete
- Draft Implementing Agreement – complete
- Draft EIS/EIR –public-review draft nearing completion

Schedule & Process To Complete

- **Winter 2017:** List Documents in Federal Register and State Clearinghouse for 90 day formal public review and workshop process
- **Spring/Summer 2017:** Respond to comments, prepare final HCP, EIS/EIR, ARP
- **Fall 2017:** Local agency hearings & adoption/submit for permit issuance

Public Outreach

- Up to 20 public workshops
- Website
- Fact sheets
- Stakeholder briefings
- Board of Supervisors, City Council hearings

JPA Formation

- Goal: realize benefits of investment now and jump start implementation through early preserve acquisitions
- Function: manage preserve system
- SSHCP Plan Partners (not JPA) issue permits


JPA Structure

- Governing Board
 - Sacramento County, Rancho Cordova, Galt
 - Approves budget, fee structure, and acquisitions; hires ED; meets two-three times yearly
- Executive Director – runs program with oversight from Implementation Committee and TAC
- Staff/consultants hired on an as needed basis



